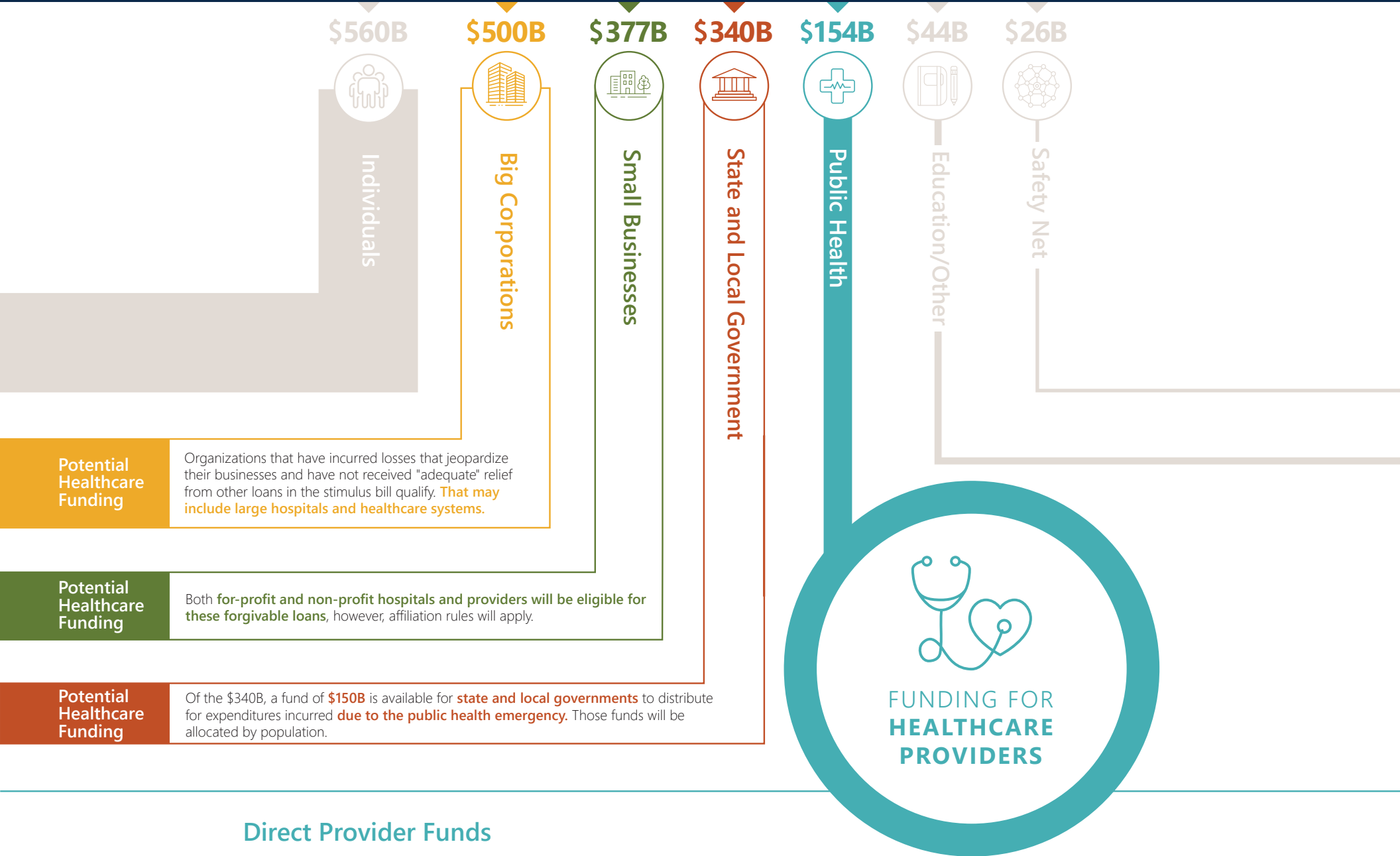

Additional Considerations for Healthcare Providers



- ⑤ Provides \$127B in direct funding to reimburse hospitals and develop diagnostics and therapeutics
- ⑤ Removes Medicare sequester for 2020 and increases Medicare payments by 20% for COVID-19 illnesses
- ⑤ Expands options for accelerated Medicare payments
- ⑤ Requires Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage to fill/refill prescriptions for up to three months
- ⑤ Eliminates \$8B in DSH cuts for FY20 and reduces cuts in FY21 from \$8B to \$4B
- ⑤ Provides telehealth flexibilities, including expansion in rural areas
- ⑤ Waives site-neutral payment cuts and 50% rule for long-term care hospitals
- ⑤ Requires payors to cover hospital-made COVID-19 tests
- ⑤ Requires providers publish the cash price for a COVID-19 test online
- ⑤ Mandates health plans cover preventative services related to COVID-19
